Superintendent Report

FY 2024 Open Positions

Our current open positions for next school year are: Principal, AD, Elementary teacher, History teacher, English teacher, Art teacher, PE teacher, and elementary school Counselor.

Impact Aid

We have received our second vouchers/payments for FY 23, which equates to \$400,988 for the Elementary (\$818,916 total to date) and \$687,564 for the High School (\$851,457 total to date).

School Building Entrance Project

I met with the Architect for Space Planning for People last week and we discussed designs and costs for phase 1 of the project. We hope to have more information in May.

Energy Upgrades Project

I met with the grant team last week and we are collaboratively working on the application. At this time, we are on schedule to submit the full application on or before the deadline in April.

NAFIS Conference

Along with other Montana Reservation representatives, I was able to meet with both Senators Daines and Tester and impress the importance of supporting the new House

bill to advance Impact Aid toward full funding. Although Rosendale and Zinke were absent due to the House in recess, I was able to meet with their staffers.

Offer of Services to Froid School District

I have offered superintendent services to Froid that would be in addition to what I currently offer Brockton. This offer is not one to supplant Brockton. In other words, Brockton would remain my primary school district. The offer to Froid is one of "joint employment" with scope of work, logistics, and compensation to be negotiated.

At this time, I am unsure of Froid's degree of interest, if any, in the offer. I have spoken with and corresponded via email with Jeff Weldon, a Felt Martin attorney in charge of hosting Froid's superintendent search, but have yet to hear from any representative of the district.

I will keep the Brockton School Board informed of any progress related to this topic.
