With a quorum present the meeting was called to order by Chairman, Sammy Nygard at 5:34 P.M.

Principal Report:

Summer school participation was good with the first session in June had 30-40 kids that attended and 20-30 kids participating in the second session. Superintendent Report

Open Positions

Our current open positions are: high school Science, 4th- 6th grade Science/History, and K-8 Music. After 2 candidates expressed interest but ultimately failed to sign a contract, we are left with no viable applicants for the high school Science position. Therefore, we will continue offering our high school science courses digitally through Ingenuity this year. The position will remain advertised until filled.

Without a viable applicant 4th- 6th Grade Science/History teacher position, I will be forced to move the incoming Special Ed teacher into the position. This teacher has a dual endorsement in special education and elementary education. I intend this move to be temporary, for one year, until the position is filled in the 2024-2025 school year. This position will also remain advertised until filled.

I'm looking for a local community member to fill the K-8 Music position. The person would be responsible for teaching 3O-minute time slots during which he/she would prepare students for our seasonal choir performances. This person would also supervise and assist the digital instructor for 7th-Sth grade music and help prepare them for our seasonal choir performances as well.

Facility Projects

Playground work starts next week. Classrooms are nearly ready for teachers to begin prepping for the new year. Many classrooms and hallways in the high school have been repainted. The gym floor was stripped and waxed.

Main Entrance

Architectural plans and artistic renderings are now on display in the District Offrce. Bid opening is set for Friday, July 28th.

Teacher Housing Renovations

The single-wide trailer the District purchased last year has been renovated. Two teachers will be living in the unit this year as well as children of one of the teachers. Three of the apartments leased from the Tribes have been lightly renovated and will be fully occupied with teachers this year.

Football Field Lighting
